Our pre-kindergarten program, after-school program and toddler program are currently housed on the first and second floors of the deSales Center (entrance on the Park Avenue side of the building at 309 Genesee Street). The building is also home to Academics First Child Care and a host of other groups use the auditorium space for special events, including the Levitt Concert Series and the Karen-Burmese community. The building is centrally located and is filled with the sounds of children at school and play.

The center was awarded \$650,000 as part of the Downtown Revitalization Initiative. This money is for an elevator that would allow us to better serve handicapped children and adults. The cost of the project has increased because of the cost of materials. Thea Bowman House will be 36 years old on October 6, 2022, and Yolanda was one of the first kids to come through our doors. I was honored with the gift of her recollections of time spent with us. She asked if we still had the little carpenter shop program at our Lafayette Street center. Don Beha, deceased for many years now, had created a little space where he taught children in our latchkey program how to build simple things like birdhouses. A flood of memories reminded me of so many people like Don Beha who touched the young lives.

At last count, 4,505 children have been enrolled in one of our programs. Many of them now bring their own children and remember fondly the camp-outs, the birthday parties, trips to the apple orchard, Halloweens at Hamilton College and the list goes on. All of this is made possible by our benefactors and volunteers. We are starting a memory box as part of our anniversary celebration.
